






Event Count by Month of Year




Event Count by Hour of the Day

CHESTER COUNTY REGIONAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM

PFC Sullivan & PFC Krissinger from the Southern Chester County Regional Police Department are members of CCERT.



The CCRERT currently has over 45 Sworn officers who all work for various Police Departments throughout the county as their primary full-time position. CCRERT also staffs 4 medics and 1 doctor.

In 2024, the team proudly assisted Chester County in 33 deployments including barricades, warrant services, and dignitary protection.



Through professionalism in routine encounters and effective de-escalation techniques, **the need for force to gain compliance was limited**. In addition to that, only the lowest levels of force were needed in those circumstances.

All of the incidents were reviewed and found to be in compliance with force guidelines and department policy. There were **2 citizen complaints** filed by members of the community against our officers during 2024, both of which were “unfounded” after investigation.
