





TRAFFIC SAFETY UNIT

TSU is comprised of 2 full-time officers, P.O. Sullivan and P.O. Madonna. Together they conduct traffic studies, speed details, and commercial vehicle inspections and enforcement. TSU helps make important decisions on how to best control traffic. Together they conducted:


